Watch the 'number six' video from 'the number blocks' on BBC I-player.                  After this, practice writing the numeral, counting out six objects from around the house or even doing six of an activity (clap your hands or jump up and down six times).</p>
<p><b><u>DAILY READING</u></b>                  Try to read to your child daily. This doesn't need to be a different story every day, go over their favourite stories and read them so they know them inside out.</p>			<p><b><u>PEOPLE WHO HELP US</u></b>                  Play the PowerPoint game posted on Dojo!                  Try to complete it a second time with fewer clicks as a challenge.</p>
<p><b><u>P.E.</u></b>                  Keep active!                  Practice throwing skills using a ball or bean bag (if you have one). Make it into a game of catch, or set up a target to reach as a challenge.</p>			<p><b><u>EXPRESSIVE ARTS &amp; DESIGN</u></b>                  Make a robot and give it a name.                  Search google images for some inspiration and ideas for what recycled materials from around the house you could use.</p>
<p><b><u>P.S.E.D.</u></b>                  Practice a key skill!                  Encourage children to learn                  -to put their coat on independently                  -use a knife and fork                  -get dressed/undressed independently                  -open a packet/bag of something</p>	<p><b><u>Education City</u></b>                  Everybody will be sent their own login to explore games and practice key skills.</p>	<p><b><u>Come and See</u></b>                  Our current topic is growing.
