Watch the 'number eight' video from 'the number blocks' on BBC I-player.                  After this, practice writing the numeral, counting out eight objects from around the house or even doing eight of an activity (clap your hands or jump up and down eight times).</p>
<p><b><u>DAILY READING</u></b>                  Try to read to your child daily. This doesn't need to be a different story every day, go over their favourite stories and read them so they know them inside out.</p>			<p><b><u>SUPERHEROES</u></b>                  What superheroes do you know?                  What are superheroes famous for?                  Ask an adult to show you a famous superhero and find out what their superpower is.                  What would be your superpower if you could choose one?</p>
<p><b><u>P.E.</u></b>                  Play Beans! The children simply have to listen and do! This can be done inside outside, around the room or on the spot.                  Jumping Bean- Jump                  Runner Bean- Run                  Baked Bean- Lie on the floor and sunbathe                  Jelly Bean- Wiggle                  Chilli Bean- Shiver. You can either create a superhero mask for your favourite superhero or make one for a superhero you have created.</p>
