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New SEND and Inclusion Strategy Incoming

Over the last 12 months; the local area has engaged in multiple consultation sessions with young people, parents, carers, school staff and partners in education, health, and social care. Additionally, we benefitted from our Local Area Inspection in March and had further information about upcoming changes to the SEND system through the governments SEND and Alternative Provision Green paper.

Through the consultation we have been able to co-produce the improvement actions for the next SEND and Inclusion strategy that will be published in January 2023. The themes of the draft strategy identified by local children and parents/carers were recently endorsed by the SEND partnership board and are now going through the necessary internal governance stages before publication.

Following publication, a series of smaller focus groups will be ongoing to discuss progress against the strategy and identify new actions or themes for the local area and invites to the focus groups will be published through the new letter so keep your eyes peeled.

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the questionnaires, focus groups, development sessions and workshops and we look forward to publishing the strategy and more information about its content once governance has been completed

Supported Internships

AMPLIFY is a group specifically for under 16's across Knowsley that meets twice a month on a Thursday between 5pm - 6:00pm. The next date is Thursday 17th November at Northwood Primary School.

NEUROPA is a 16+ which also meets every other fortnight on a Thursday between 5pm - 6:00pm. The next date is Thursday November 24th on Teams (will resume in person meetings thereafter).

The event was open to all and some EAL parents participated in the event with costumes and reading books from their countries. Movema the professional dance group held a workshop teaching children and adults dances from all over the world. Everybody joined in with great enthusiasm.

We also hosted an Origami class where children and parents learnt how to make cranes. The concentration and eagerness of these groups was amazing. They were taught this by a member of the team's husband who had his audience transfixed. The Sudanese School also joined us demonstrating dances from North, East, South and West Sudan. The dances were lively and colourful. 17 Sudanese children and their parents were involved in the dances. Their grand finale was a Sudanese Wedding Dance. The audience were given sweets and pastries to sample as the wedding ceremony took place.

All in all, it was a great day and was successful in so many ways. It was a fantastic way of showcasing the different languages and cultures in Knowsley as well as bringing people together. It allowed people of different cultures to mix as well as informing the people of Knowsley about the wealth of culture we have.'

Discover Kooth & Qwell webinars for professionals in Cheshire & Merseyside

Kooth.com and Qwell.io are free, safe and anonymous sites that offer mental health and wellbeing support to young people and adults across Cheshire & Merseyside. We are staffed by our fully trained and qualified counselling team who are available until 10pm each night, 365 days per year.

The sites also feature self help tools including online journaling and mindfulness techniques. We have a community space on our magazine and discussion boards where any users can give and receive advice and support from others.

During our webinars, we will give an overview of the support available on Kooth (our young person's service commissioned across Cheshire & Merseyside) and Qwell (our adult's service commissioned in the Wirral, Knowsley & St Helens). There will also be clinical and safeguarding information shared and an opportunity to ask any questions you may have about our services.
