## Year Four

Hello! I am Mrs Culvin and I will be the class teacher in Year Four. Most of you already know me as I have worked in the school for many years now and have taught many of the children in Year Four before. My working days are Monday- Friday. Mrs Dally teaches Year Four on a Wednesday morning and we also have the help of Mrs Connolly and Mrs Corns throughout the course of the week. This document will help you understand what to expect in Year Four and to help your child look forward to some of the exciting things we will learn!

## Homework

Homework will be set every Thursday, alternating between English and Maths Homework. This homework should be completed in their homework book and returned to school by the following Tuesday. The first homework will be set on Thursday $14^{\text {th }}$ September.

## Spellings

Spelling and Times Table tests are every Friday. New Spellings are given on this day. Please ensure your child has their spelling book in school every Friday. Children are responsible for recording their weekly results in their spelling book.

## P.E

P.E is every Monday and Tuesday afternoon.

Please send your child into school in their P.E kit on these days.

## Home Readers

Children will be listened to every Tuesday. If required, their book will be changed on this day. It is essential for children to read their home reading book at home. Children are allowed to choose a book they have at home but this must be brought into school on a Tuesday for a member of staff to see. In Year Four we follow the reading rainbow. Please find more information about this later in the document.

## MTC

The national times table check (MTC) is an online test for all Year Four pupils that takes place in a two week window in June 2024. The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It is an on-screen check consisting of $\mathbf{2 5}$ times table questions. Your child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have $\mathbf{6}$ seconds to answer each question with a three second rest between each one. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete.
More information will be given later in the year.

## Swimming

Year Four will be swimming for two weeks this year. Dates will be given as soon as possible.

## Holy Communion and Reconciliation

We will dojo out dates for First Holy Communions and Reconciliations as soon as they are finalised. We hope to let you know as soon as possible. Children follow the 'with you always' programme which is led by Mrs Connolly and supported by Father Dominic.

## Snack and Water Bottles

Children can bring a piece of fruit or a vegetable in for snack each day. Children must have only water in their drink bottle for school. Please make sure this is clearly labelled.

## Uniform

Please make sure all belongings, especially jumpers and cardigans are clearly labelled with your child's name.

## Keyboards

Year Four children will continue to learn the keyboard every Tuesday as they did in Year Three.

Children should read at home for 10 minutes at least 3 times per week. It is so important to encourage reading to support all aspects of English, including writing. In school, we will encourage children to read a wide variety of texts. Home reading books should be handed in each Tuesday.
Every time a child reads at home, they will gain a point up to a maximum of 7 a week. This must be noted in their record daily. Points will be totalled on a Tuesday. Children will then receive a certificate and small prize after every 25 reads and will move up the rainbow.
If they reach the end of the rainbow and make it to the sun (after 200 reads) they will receive a larger special prize in July.
