BRANCH ONE- CREATION AND COVENANT

(3rd September - 25th October)

In the first half term, children will focus on 'Revelation'. In an age appropriate way, pupils will consider how the world exists and how all that is came to be. They will learn about the Christian belief that all that exists comes from God, the Creator, who Christians call father, and that this belief is found in Scripture and the prayers of the Catholic



Church. The Church teaches that with this belief come responsibilities to take care of the world God has gifted to humanity. One of the ways the Church expresses this responsibility is through the Catholic Social Teaching (CST) principles of stewardship, human dignity and solidarity, which Pope Francis expresses in his encyclical 'Laudato Si' (2015).

BRANCH TWO- PROPHECY AND PROMISE

(4th November –20th December)

The focus of this branch is for pupils to develop an early understanding of the Christian belief that God showed us the full depth of his love by sending Jesus his Son. In Jesus, the invisible God becomes visible, and his love is poured out as the child in the manger at Bethlehem. Pupils will experience Advent traditions, see the Christmas crib and learn Christmas carols with the secular traditions that run alongside the Christmas season.

COME AND SEE AUTUMN NEWSLETTER 2024

'Come and See at home'

As we implement the new RED gradually, the Come and See program will still be followed by children in Y2-Y6. The Autumn term's theme is about understanding where we come from in the light of Creation, explored through the topics *Family, Belonging and Loving.* We will also spend two weeks finding out about another faith— **Judaism.**



DOMESTIC CHURCH - FAMILY

(11th September - 6th October)

In the first topic, the children will focus on life as a gift, ourselves as unique and loved creations, and the love and care that can be expressed in our family groups.



Make a collage using family photos of all significant family members – grandparents, parents, children, aunts, uncles, cousins etc. - including those who may have died.



BAPTISM/CONFIRMATION - BELONGING

(9th October – 10^h November)

In the next topic, we will focus on the call to belong, and on Baptism and Confirmation, sacraments of God's gift of life and friendship.

Suggestions for home activities

Talk about your child's baptism, how special it was, and the people who shared the day with you. Look at photos if possible.

OTHER WORLD RELIGION - Judaism

(13th November – 24th November)

Children will be learning about a different aspect of Judaism, its beliefs and practices.

Suggestions for home activities

Ask children to tell you about what they have learnt, and maybe research some other facts about the Jewish people and their faith.





ADVENT/CHRISTMAS - LOVING

(27th November -21st December)

In this topic, the children will focus on our capacity to enter into loving relationships and the perfect gift, given in God's love, Jesus, who was born as one of us.
